Circular

“Make in Maharashtra” on the lines of “Make in India” will campaign for the implementation of the government policy to boost its industry sector, to control quality of factory and shall implement a specific operating system besides managing the interests of the workers who works in the factory is the policy of the government. Accordingly for the effective implementation of the Factories Act, 1948, the government is considering the Randomization inspection scheme for the Random inspection. Accordingly directorate of industrial safety and health has submitted proposal to establish state level inspection agency for carrying out inspection of registered factories under the factories Act, 1948 as per direction given to Directorate of Industrial safety and health. It is intended to implement the enforcement by deciding the agency’s structure, process, inspection, accident and systematic operating procedure of complaint enquiry.

States should monitor more effectively the existing factory and there should be transparency and overall the whole system shall be uniform and with the intention of specific action plan. Following State level inspection agency and standard operating procedure for this purpose is constituted.

1. State level inspection agency will be as following:-

Sr. No.	Description	Designation
1	Director, Industrial safety and Health	Chairman
2	Addl/Joint Director, Industrial safety and health of respective department	Member
3	Deputy director, Industrial Safety and health	Member
4	Addl. Director, Industrial Safety and health	Member Secretary

2. Procedure of state level inspection agency (SLIA) is decided as follows:

- 1.State level inspection agency will make 5% list of factories out of total registered factories under the Factories Act, 1948 for each month as per randomization scheme. For the purpose of this classification of factories and its percentage is decided as follows:-

Sr. No.	Type of Factories	Percentage
1	Major accidents hazards (MAH)	1
2	Chemical (Chemical & 2cb)	2

3	Factories having more than 100 workers	1
4	Factories having less than 100 workers	1

2. This agency will decide randomized list of factories for inspection, monitor on inspection procedure, co-ordinate between head office and regional office for this purpose, make periodic action of plan for the improvement of quality of inspection and as per government approved template will resolve the complaint of factories regarding the factory inspection, accident enquiry and complaint enquiry.
3. This committee, while preparing the procedure will ensure that major accidents hazards and chemical factory will select on priority and it will be inspected once in a year. The list of the factories will be allotted to the concerned regional office at start of the month.
4. Accordingly regional office head will allot the factories to their respective Dy/Asst. Director before one day of inspection.
5. Dy/Asst director will upload the template related with inspection remarks after doing inspection of factory within 72 hours of inspection at website (www.mahakamgar.gov.in). For this purpose Accenture, Information technology advisor will develop process with the help of mahaonline and link to www.mahakamgar.gov.in
6. Mahaonline will make the process for uploading the inspection remarks. For this process user ID and password will be provided to Dy/Asst Director.
7. If the inspection remarks has not uploaded within 72 hours after inspection by Dy/asst director explanation will be asked regarding it to them.
8. After reviewing the not inspected factories in last month, will make the list of factories for randomized inspection for next month and consider the factories which were not inspected during last month.
9. The selection of factories for next year as per randomization process for inspection very dangerous factories and chemical factories will select as per priority after inspection of factories as per randomization scheme during current year. Moreover not inspected factories during last year will be included.

With reference to this proposal, the forms regarding the Standard operating procedure (SOP) and templates is being sent independently to this Directorate.
